

Calbe


Calbe offers a variety of sights and activities that allow visitors to immerse themselves in the town's rich culture, cuisine and history.

Calbe is also known as the "Rolandstadt am Saalebogen". An impressive statue of "Roland" stands on the market square. The Roland Festival is held in his honour every year in June. Another festival is the Bollenfest. This traditional festival is celebrated every year on the first weekend in September. The onion, also known as "Bolle", has a long tradition in Calbe, which can be traced back to the cultivation of onions.

Calbe's oldest still-operating pub, the "Heimatstube", is also located on the market square. On the ground floor is the "Brauner Hirsch" inn, where you can dine well and inexpensively.







Bernburg

The imposing Bernburg Castle is one of the town's main attractions. It towers over the Saale river and is an outstanding example of medieval architecture. The castle is home to the castle museum, where you will find historical exhibits, works of art and insights into the history of the region, as well as the Eulenspiegelt tower, the largest Eulenspiegel monument in Germany.


There is a large fairytale garden in the "Paradies" excursion restaurant. Voice and movement-controlled fairy tale figures bring fairy tales by the Brothers Grimm to life.

Bernburg Zoo is a popular zoo located on the opposite side of the Saale from our mooring harbour. Bernburg Zoo is home to a variety of animals from all over the world. Here visitors can observe exotic animals and spend a pleasant day surrounded by nature.

The "Krumholz" park railway takes you to the zoo and the fairytale garden.







Halle

Halle is the birthplace of the famous composer George Frideric Handel. The Handel House is a museum dedicated to the life and work of the composer. It also organises concerts and events related to classical music. The Handel Monument stands in the centre of the market square and was inaugurated on the 100th anniversary of Handel's death. The monument shows the composer looking towards his adopted country of England, where he was buried in London's Westminster Abbey in 1759.

Every year, Handel festivals are held in his honour for almost three weeks from mid-May, attracting thousands of visitors to Halle.

The Lantern Festival takes place along the Saale every year on the last weekend in August. A varied programme with live music, duck races and many other activities is on offer.

The Saale promenade is a popular place for walking, cycling and relaxing. It stretches along the river and offers a picturesque view of the city. There are park benches and green spaces along the way, perfect for a cosy break. It is a popular way to reach the many sights along the Saale. For example, the Peissnitzinsel, the Forstwerder, a protected river island, or the famous Jahnhöhle directly on the banks of the Saale.





Discover hidden treasures in Halle

If you are looking for a unique experience, then these insider tips are just the thing for you:

At the "Krug zum grünen Kranze" inn, delicious regional dishes are on offer. There is a landing stage nearby. A digestive walk takes you over the Giebichenstein Bridge to Giebichenstein Castle.

Close to the river you will find the Halloren Museum, which tells the fascinating story of the famous Halloren balls. Immerse yourself in the world of chocolate making and sample the irresistible Halloren creations. A must for those with a sweet tooth and chocolate lovers!

The Hallesche Brauhaus is a real insider tip for beer lovers. Home-brewed beer specialities are brewed here and served in a cosy atmosphere. Discover the diversity of the local art of brewing and savour the different types of beer in a convivial atmosphere.





Merseburg

The impressive Merseburg Castle is located directly on the Saale river and is one of the city's main attractions. Here you can visit the Museum of Cultural History and view the stone raven cage in the castle forecourt, which tells the famous raven legend associated with Bishop Tilo von Trotha.


Merseburg Cathedral is an example of Romanesque and Gothic architecture. The cathedral treasury contains an outstanding collection of medieval and modern works of art.

The Wüsteneutzsch lock stairs or Wüsteneutzsch lock ruins, which are located near Kreypau, tell the stories of past waterways and shipping in the region. A place that not only arouses the curiosity of history buffs, but also offers a picturesque and peaceful spot in nature for a relaxing walk.
